Michael Allen Formalizes Campaign for State Assembly

SANTA ROSA – State Assembly candidate Michael Allen today announced that Senator Pat Wiggins and Assemblywoman Noreen Evans will serve as Co-Chairs of his campaign for California's 7th Assembly district. He also announced the retention of Whitehurst/Mosher Campaign Strategies and Media as consultants to his campaign. Allen seeks to succeed Assemblywoman Noreen Evans, who is termed out of the state Assembly.
